I attended this strategic planning on behalf of Missanabie Cree First Nation for Mushkegowuk Council in Orillia, Ontario. Missanabie Cree will be leading the Tribal Council with respect to emergency management, economic development and training for our portfolio. This planning will be done in several phases.

I have been working with MCDC and completing community consultations and giving detailed descriptions on all of the projects that the business corporation has been involved in. they have been met with many questions and few concerns.

On a more glorious note, I am happy to announce that we now own Ernie's Campground. There will be a strategic planning sessions with our leadership when it comes to how and what our First Nation and Community leaders are going to be doing with the business, the property and surrounding structures. I would imagine that during the gathering, we will be having a ceremony marking this milestone in Missanabie Cree's history. We are hoping that you all can attend.

Our Ontario Land claim is moving forward and the appeal has been submitted by our lawyers. We are negotiating concurrently in the hopes that we can come to a resolution without litigation.

In the upcoming months, Lands and Resources and Family Services plan to make hub visits for community consultation. This will include updates on Family Services activities, Land Code development, and all that Lands and resources has been achieving in within their department.

The elections are near and I would like to remind all those who are running to be kind to one another.

Boozhoo, my name is Cynthia Tribe. I am the new Family Support Worker for Missanabie Cree First Nation. I come from Kettle & Stoney Point First Nation in southern Ontario. I recently moved back to Sault Ste Marie with my husband and 2 German Shepard's. I am a graduate of Sault College where I received my Native Community Worker-Child

& Family diploma. After graduating from college, I went back to my community to work. I accepted a Child & Youth Worker position with the Nimkee Nupigawagan Healing Center and worked 10 years fulltime and stayed on part-time for another 5 years. After leaving Nimkee I went to work with the homeless in London for 2 years. I yearned to work with my own people and applied to the Kiikeewaaniikaan Southwest Regional Healing Center to work as their Crisis/ Family Counsellor. My application was accepted at the Family Healing Center, and I began a rewarding position working with Indigenous people from across Turtle Island. After the healing lodge was closed, I worked for Addictions Services of London, and worked for Counterpoint in London. Counterpoint is a Harm Reduction service. Once again, I prefer to work with my own people. I was happy to work again with our own people when I went to work for the Chippewa of the Thames First Nation. I started out as their Harm Reduction Worker and moved into the Child Well Being position. I look forward to working with the Missanabie Cree First Nation community.



The Lands and Resources Department field season is underway for 2022. The Mineral Development Advisor has made two field visits to monitor activities of both the Alamos and Argonaut mines in Dubreuilville and we have membership participation in a Bat Rehabilitation committee that Argonaut has organized.

Ground breaking on reserve took place May 30th, and was heralded by a prayer ceremony provided by Isabel Souliere, Northland Drill is the first operational activity of community creation, and it will be drilling to determine if there is well water for the first planned duplexes to be built along Island View Camp road. (This submission was written the day of drilling so the outcome is not yet known).

In June, the department will be leading field work at the Renabie mine site, to lower beaver dams, and brush out roads, a service we have agreed to provide Barrick Gold. This month we also plan to start a Hub Tour, presenting on the programs of the department to all Missanabie Cree Hubs, starting in Sault Ste. Marie.

Otherwise the department is very busy planning the lands and resources activities, workshops, and presentations for the children's camp and summer gathering. We look forward to seeing you there!

we have scheduled weekly meetings with our development partner Ellis Don Community Builders that include our legal counsel and Aawan Maskwa to begin the process to develop the site for elders apartments. We have booked May 26th to meet virtually with Toronto area indigenous housing groups and city staff. We also are looking for housing projects in the London area and had met with Oxford county staff to discuss potential projects

Indigenous Services Canada - we meet with them weekly to further develop IVC as an evacuation host site capable of eventually hosting up to 800 evacuees. Aawan Maskwa is leading the business plan development and our team is working with the brokers representing the owners of the new bunk facilities.

Investment Strategy - we entered into a service contract with the Canadian Executive Services Organization (CESO) and have obtained the services of a seasoned financial advisor. His role will be to assist the MCBC board in developing an investment strategy and develop a potential private equity fund for

Missanabie.

Argonaut - we met with Argonaut at our monthly implementation meeting, where the Band Manager provided a community update to the mine. We discussed accommodations at the site for a MCFN member's staff and the recruitment of members for employment opportunities.

ISN Maskwa - Chief Gauthier, Aawan Maskwa and I met with our ISN partners and developed a strategic plan to oversee the growth of the company in the short and long terms. It is estimated that ISN Maskwa will surpass the ISN parent company in revenues by this fall.

Annual Gathering - the team at MCBC is planning for the business day during the Gathering with sponsorship requests, swag and confirming businesses that wish to set up a booth at the gathering. The Executive Assistant is representing the team at the MCFN gathering meetings.

ELDER'S CARE FUNDING

Purpose:

Missanabie Cree First Nation's Family Services Team has set out the following guidelines based on funding available from the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care. Requests that fall outside of this scope of funding are to be submitted as a RAMA request which is subject to Chief and Council approval.

Due to the amount of funding provided, Missanabie Cree has set limits on amounts that can be applied to this funding specifically to ensure we are able to make services available for all elders.

Elders of Missanabie Cree First Nation are able to apply for services and reimbursements of eligible costs by completing the Family Services Intake form.

If the request does not meet the funding criteria, or are over and above the limits set below, the remainder of the request is then submitted to Chief and Council to be considered under the RAMA Health category.

The Ministry of Long Term Care (MOHLTC) provides funding to First Nation communities to cover expenses in the following categories (A, B, and C). Under these categories we are providing the services listed below by way of direct pay to providers or reimbursement to the individual making the request:

- A) Community Support Services
 - a. Meal Services
 - b. Transportation
 - c. Caregiver Support Services
 - d. Adult Day Programs (1-2 days per week)
 - e. Home maintenance and repair
 - i. Maintenance includes: snow removal, mowing
 - ii. Repairs include: leaking roof/water damage, and any damage or repair required that significantly affects the state of being able to remain living in the home
 - iii. Accessibility modifications (renting vs home ownership may have different eligibility)
 - **Emergency Response Services** f.
 - **Foot Care**
- B) Homemaking/Personal Support Services (4 hours per week)
 - a. Housecleaning
 - b. Laundry
 - c. Shopping
 - d. Preparing Meals
 - e. Assisting a person with personal hygiene or routine activities of living

ELDER'S CARE FUNDING

- C) Professional Services (Must provide receipts for reimbursement)
 - a. Occupational therapy and assistive devices
 - b. Physiotherapy
 - c. Speech-language pathology Services
 - d. Dietetic services
 - e. Diagnostic and laboratory services
 - f. Medical Supplies and treatment equipment
 - g. Pharmacy Services
 - h. Respiratory Therapy Services

Missanabie Cree First Nation under the funder's requirements are expected to:

- Assess the person's requirement for community services
- Determine the eligibility for community services
- Develop a plan of service for each eligible person
- Set out the amount of each service provided to the person
- Review the person's requirement regularly and revise plan of services as necessary when changes are required

Additional Emergency Services provided not under MOHLTC related:

- 1. Rental Assistance for arrears (1 month paid, once per elder)
- 2. Last month's Rental assistance (Once per elder)
- 3. Dental care and denture (costs over and above NIHB coverage/other insurances may be eligible)
- 4. Prescription glasses (costs over and above NIHB coverage/other insurances may be eligible)
- Diabetic needs (special circumstance) (costs over and above NIHB coverage/other insurances may be eligible)

ELDER'S CARE FUNDING

Steps for processing and approval

June 2022

Step 1 - application

Contact the Family Well-Being Worker via phone 705-254-2702 ext. 206 or email at jharris@missanabiecree.com.

Request to complete the Family Services Intake form. You will be asked to provide information and documentation for back up.

Information needed to complete the form:

- Personal Information (Contact, mailing address, status number, date of birth)
- Details for the request (situational details) •
- Quotes/Service Fees/detailed bill
- Doctors note (nature of the need, duration, frequency)
- Letter of support from organizations (if applicable)
- Letter of denial (if applicable from NIHB, insurance, other entities)

All applicants must sign the release of Information section which enables staff from Missanabie Cree First Nation o contact medical professionals (i.e. Doctor's, PSW's, Organizations involved in the request) when it pertains to health.

Collection of this information allows staff to ensure information is available if needed to confirm the request. All information collected remains confidential.

Step 2 - Review

The Family Well-Being worker may ask that any missing information is obtained by the individual prior to file review and approval process.

Once documentation is received by the Family Well Being Worker, the file will be reviewed and possibly reviewed by other Family Services Staff, if required to access all available resources.

STEP 3 – Approval Process

The Family Well-Being Worker will within 7 days inform the applicant that the information has been reviewed and will be able to identify if it has been approved under MOHLTC funding or if the file required Council review under the RAMA process.

If the file requires Council review, the Family Well-Being Worker will advise the applicant of the next Chief and Council meeting date.

Within 3 days of the next Council meeting an update will be provided to the applicant on the status or review/approval.
